The following is an update of all NOAA Corps nominations:

10669 - O-1 (15), O-3 (1), Executive nominations for BOTC 108 and Mr. Van Westendorp. Package at the Senate since March 30.


11529 - O-2 thru O-5 (67), 2006 executive nominations. Package at the White House since April 26.

11679 - Effecting inter-service transfer of Sweeney. This Commission must be signed on May 31, 2006, as he will be detached from the U.S. Navy on May 30, 2006. Package cleared NOAA and is proceeding through DOC clearance.

11737 - O-6 (5), 2006 executive nominations. Package proceeding through DOC clearance.

The Officer Personnel Board completed a review of all officer records, excluding captains, who were not previously reviewed by one of the four promotion boards. Based on the review of the records, this OPB made a few recommendations to the Director, NOAA Corps, and the results of those approved recommendations will be forwarded accordingly. The Board made note of those officers who did not have an OER on file for all or a portion of 2005. Officers are responsible for the timely submission of their OER. Failure to do so reflects poorly on all in the rating chain. However, if you have done everything in your power to complete your OER, but cannot get others in the rating chain to do their part, document your efforts by submitting an e-mail message to the Director, CPC stating such. The Director, CPC shall include the e-mail message in your OPF until such time as the OER is complete and made part of your record. If a current OER is missing and we have no further explanation as to why, the Board may incorrectly conclude the officer to be at fault.

The 109th BOTC will be graduating on May 25, 2006. VADM Lautenbacher is the keynote speaker for the graduation. Congratulations to the officers of BOTC 109 and best of luck to all during your first sea assignment.
