Recommended Training for all Officers

On 15 October an announcement from the Acting Director, Workforce Management Office was sent to all NOAA managers and supervisors introducing a new webinar series that will cover the ins and outs of the

President's Hiring Reform Initiative that becomes effective on 1 November 2010 and how NOAA is implementing the changes. As NOAA leaders, I encourage each of you to participate as it is important we are knowledgeable of and understand the role of supervisory officials in the recruiting and selection process.

Restrictions to Political Activities

Set forth below is a brief summary of the political activity restrictions for all Executive Branch employees and further restrictions for NOAA Corps Officers. Note that the further restrictions are pursuant to <u>NOAA Corps Directives, Chapter 9</u> (Complete details are outlined).

All Executive Branch employees are barred from engaging in partisan political activities on Government premises or during duty hours, and they may not use Government resources in connection with such activities. In addition, all employees are subject to restrictions during non-duty hours, including a bar on partisan political fundraising (cannot accept, receive, or solicit political contributions) and there are restrictions on running for political office. NOAA Corps Officers (as well as career-SES employees) are subject to further restrictions. NOAA Corps Officers may not actively assist in the conduct of a partisan campaign (e.g., campaign management, solicit votes, stuff envelopes, make speeches) or serve as an officer in a political organization, even during non-duty hours. However, during non-duty hours, NOAA Corps Officers (not in uniform and not using Government resources) may actively participate in nonpartisan elections and referenda; regarding partisan candidate campaigns, they may vote, make contributions, sign nominating petitions, and engage in similar activities.

Direct Access Passwords

Below is the procedure to request a new Direct Access password. You no longer have to submit an email to Coast Guard Customer Service. Do the following:

- 1. Go to the Direct Access home page at: <u>https://hr.direct-access.us</u>
- 2. In the USER/ID Block, Put in your Employee ID number
- 3. Click the "FORGOT MY PASSWORD" on the Right
- 4. Put in your Employee ID number again
- 5. Click Continue
- 6. Put in the Last Four (4) of your SSN
- 7. Click Continue
- 8. Wait for the message "a new password has been sent to your email address"
- 9. Check your NOAA email for your new TEMPORARY password
- 10. After using your TEMPORARY password to log-in, the temporary Password will need to be reset

PLEASE REMEMBER: If you do not use Direct Access for more than 30 days, you will need to request a new password following the steps above.
