Director's Message

In addition, the relationship between the sea going officers and the aviators is strengthened through events such as these. A lot of issues were brought up during the CPC talks with the class and AOC officers, many focusing on payroll concerns, awards, uniforms, promotion boards, post 9/11 GI Bill transferability and others. Additional side meetings brought up concerns with the need for an informal mentoring or coaching program and better training in legal and harassment issues for all officers. Critical items have been addressed and over the next couple of months we will address the general concerns through Webinars (one for payroll scheduled in November), Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs) on our website, the FY12 Officer Corps Management Plan (out in January) and various CYBERFLASH articles. CPC also plans to visit officers in REFTRA, during the CO and XO seminars and as many ships and other central locations as possible over the winter.

This week we had a promotion board. In an "up or out" system, one could claim that promotion boards are not always a "positive" thing, but I would argue that they are. It is always refreshing and uplifting to see the great talent that is coming up through the ranks. (In order to ward off calls to CPC – the results of the Board will not be available until the recommendations are approved by the Secretary).

And finally, this week brings a handful of retirements. Again, not entirely positive – it is bittersweet to leave any single assignment...glad to be moving on but sad to be leaving. So, I imagine that at the end of a long career of hard work, support and counsel to others, and many contributions to the Corps, NOAA and the Nation, retirement is an exceptionally proud, yet bittersweet, moment. Indeed these officers should be proud of their accomplishments. Please remember to thank officers for their service and their support. The relationships formed over the years of their career do not end...they will continue beyond retirement either directly or indirectly in the lives of officers they have influenced. NOAA Corps is not just a job, it's a community and we are fortunate to be a part of it.
