Today also marks another milestone in RADM Bailey's 32-year career...his last BOTC graduation in the position of Director, NOAA Corps. I would like to take this opportunity to send a heartfelt congratulations and thank you to him – both personally for the guidance and advice provided throughout my career, and professionally, as the Director of CPC, for the support he has provided to the Corps in his years as our Director. During his tenure, 8 classes of BOTC were recruited into the Corps, sent to training and subsequently to the fleet, amounting to approximately 135 officers. (This is in addition to the nearly 90 officers who entered the Corps during his assignment as Director, CPC). These officers that he was responsible for adding to the Corps have since moved up the ranks and

made significant contributions to the fleet, OMAO and NOAA. As Director, RADM Bailey fully supported CPC in all of his actions. Understanding the criticality of maintaining an influx of qualified officers into the Corps, he backed the decision to add a second recruiter and insisted on two BOTCs a year as the standard, fighting for funding as needed. In interest and support of the Leadership Development Plan, he used Director, OMAO's accounting to pay for leadership training for mid-grade officers, enabling CPC to train as many officers in as short a time as possible. In his daily work of approving assignment changes, award recommendations, and Officer Personnel Board results, he showed unprecedented interest in and support of each individual officer in the Corps. The NOAA Corps as a whole, and every officer lucky enough to have RADM Bailey's signature on something in his or her OPF, has benefited greatly from his leadership and his ability to champion and, when needed, defend, the NOAA Corps to all levels of NOAA and DOC leadership. For that he has earned our trust and respect, and I hope that we can repay him by continuing to make him proud of the work we do and the way we do it!

IT Security Awareness

As a reminder, the 2012 NOAA Information Technology Security Awareness Course is now available for all employees at: http://noaa.learnsecuritywith.us/. In order to continue to use your NOAA computing resources, you are required to complete the course by July 26, 2012. Questions about the course should be directed to your Line Office IT Security Officer, or email at itsec@noaa.gov. Maintaining the security of NOAA's information is an ongoing process. Successful implementation of this process requires you to be adequately informed of the latest threats, and know your responsibilities to combat those threats. For this reason, it is a mandatory requirement for each NOAA IT user (government, contractor, associate or temporary personnel) to complete the NOAA Information Technology Security Awareness Course each year. Temporary personnel include visitors, guest workers, etc., who plan to work at a NOAA site and use NOAA IT resources for more than one month. Temporary and new employees must take the course within three days after issuance of NOAA IT equipment.

NOAA's Information Technology Security Awareness Program remains successful due to your continued diligence and efforts to secure NOAA's information resources.
