WVPR invites you to join us for an engaging and insightful discussion on how failure to prevent and respond to harmful behaviors can lead to a lack of trust in the institution. Institutional betrayal occurs when the institution you trust or depend upon mistreats you. It can be overt, but it can also be less obvious, for instance, a failure to protect you when protection is a reasonable expectation. Institutional courage is the antidote to institutional betrayal. It includes institutional accountability and transparency. This event will explore these concepts and how NOAA can be a courageous organization moving in the right direction for a healthy work environment.

Jennifer Joy Freyd, PhD is the Founder and President of the Center for Institutional Courage. She is also Professor Emerit of Psychology at the University of Oregon. Freyd is a theoretician and expert on interpersonal and institutional betrayal trauma and sexual violence and discrimination within institutional settings. Freyd is a widely published and renowned scholar known for her theories of betrayal trauma, institutional betrayal, institutional courage, and created the acronym for deny, attack, and reverse victim and offender tactic (DARVO.)
