## ON BEING A COMMISSIONED OFFICER - PART 1.

An officer who swears or affirms that simple oath joins a 200-year tradition by making a commitment to our nation and our Constitution. Just as in times past, it is the commitment of "life, fortune and sacred honor." It is a guarantee to the nation and to any enemy of the nation that the officer is prepared to take any action necessary to keep our nation free.
