VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITY - Leadership Defense Panel

During the seventeen-week Basic Officer Training Class, NOAA Officer Candidates work diligently, training and preparing themselves to become leaders in the NOAA Corps. In the process, they develop and write a personal Leadership Philosophy. The capstone to this training is defense of their philosophy before a panel of officers. Panels consist of at least three officers and are usually a mix of NOAA and Coast Guard. We are looking for active duty officers to participate in this important event on May 29, 2013, from 0800 – 1200. Volunteers would be expected to review (in advance) approximately five Leadership Philosophies and develop challenging and thought-provoking questions about them (suggestions/examples can be provided if needed). CPC can support travel to New London on a case by case basis as budgets and travel caps allow. This is a tremendous opportunity to support the development of junior officers while experiencing the integrated training environment that has been established at the Coast Guard Academy. It is also a fabulous chance to meet with the new NOAA Corps Officers. The senior officers who have participated on this panel in the past have found it very rewarding.

Uniform and Awards Board

The Uniform and Awards Board (UAB) held its monthly meeting on 3 May, 2013 and 20 nominations were reviewed. Additionally, the UAB discussed the status of pending and future changes/updates to the NOAA Corps Directives. The UAB has identified a few changes that should be addressed in future revisions of the NOAA Corps Directives:

- The 1/16" bronze 'S' device is not available from any uniform or award outfitters. The UAB proposes to authorize the 3/16" bronze 'S' device for wear with the ACO Science Award miniature medals.

- The Navy announced in November that they are phasing out the Navy All-Weather Coat and replacing it with the Army trench coat. NOAA Corps will follow suit and change the Directives to reflect this jacket substitution.

- With NOAA Corps officer candidates completing BOTC with the United States Coast Guard, and legislation pending for physical requirements for officers, PT uniform guidelines will need to be outlined.

The next meeting of the UAB is planned for 7 June 2013. Award nominations need to be received by CPC no later than 31 May 2013.
